

Topic/Subject of the Activity	Gender Jurisprudence in the Indian Context
Objectives for conducting Activity	<p>to raise awareness among the students about the importance of gender equality and the need to break stereotypes.</p> <p>to provide students with knowledge about three major laws of the Indian Constitution: the POCSO Act, Domestic Violence Act, and PNDT Act.</p> <p>to inspire the participants to become advocates for gender equality and take action to create a safer and more equal society.</p>
