The events organized and the activities conducted by the college in the academic year 2017-18 have been documented under 7 criteria as prescribed by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council.

1. Curricular Aspects

- ➤ The **Academic Calendar** for the year 2017-18 has been provided in **Annexure I** and outlines the schedule of activities and events planned for the academic year.
- The seminars, workshops, field visits and talks by experts from different fields of specialization were organised in keeping with the students' needs as revealed by an analysis of the **Entry and Exit point questionnaires**(**Annexure II**).
- ➤ STIE followed the **Contextualized Curriculum** wherein a plethora of activities were conducted by the teacher educators to enhance and enrich the syllabus prescribed by the University of Mumbai for each subject included in the curriculum. This wasbased on the constructivist theory of teaching and learning. The underlying principle was that learning takes place when teachers are able to present information in a way that


students are able to construct meaning based on their own experiences. The contextualized curriculum emphasized problem solving skills, assisted students in becoming self-regulated learners, justify their reasoning, relate their learning to diverse life contexts and apply their knowledge to make learning relevant and meaningful. An overview of the Contextualized Curriculum followed for the different subjects has been provided in **Annexure III**.

2. Teaching-Learning and Evaluation

- ➤ The **ISI model** was used to transact the contextualized curriculum described in the earlier criterion. The acronym ISI is based on the following components:
- ✓ I Introduction to the Content (through a series of lectures /suggested reference material)
- ✓ S Supplementary Activities (In this phase a broad VIEW is offered to the different topics of the syllabus through:
 - ❖ V-Visits to the field
 - I-Inquiry based learning
 - ❖ E-Experiential learning
 - **❖** W-Workshops
- ✓ I Integration of the Experiences(through assessments, assignments, reflective journaling of activities conducted)

This ensured that the training provided to each student emerging from the portals of STIE bore the mark of quality. This was achieved through a well-balanced exposure to the theoretical and practical dimensions of each subject in the course. **Annexure IV** provides a gist of the teaching strategies employed in the different subjects.

- ➤ The schedule of Curricular and Co-Curricular Activities conducted through the academic year 2017-18 has been provided in **Annexure V.**
- ➤ The institution offered the Master of Arts (M.A.) Education Degree in association with IDOL (Institution of Distance and Open Learning), University of Mumbai and was a contact centre for the same. Each faculty member of STIE conducted lectures for various subjects of the course.
- ➤ The results for the academic year 2017-18 semester-wise has been represented graphically below to enable a comparative evaluation of the students' progress.



3. Research, Innovations and Extension

Research

➤ This year saw the inception of the Research Cell of STIE – **Pratiti** (meaning 'A deep insight' in Sanskrit. The inaugural ceremony of the cell was marked by the annual research paper reading session organized on the 21st March 2018.

These initiatives in the area of research were in keeping with the suggestions of the NAAC that the college should work towards establishing a research culture among the faculty and students of STIE. The above mentioned research endeavours helped to disseminate the findings of research studies conducted by staff and students of the institution and also provided a forum for learning from studies conducted by other researchers.

Innovations

❖ The Institution hosted the All-Mumbai Interschool/Intercollegiate Environment Festival Planit-E based on the EXCEL model of entrepreneurship. The phases of the model namely, Engage, Explore, Communicate, Empower and Launch are directed towards inculcating the entrepreneurial skills of planning, organizing, decision making, risk taking and leadership among the trainees. Planit-E is an environment based festival and attempts to amalgamate education and entertainment thus setting it apart from the routine cultural festivals. The Ecofest had 77 educational institutions across the city participating in the 10 competitions based on themes of environmental significance. It provided a platform for networking with environmental agencies like

- SOSVA, WWF (World Wide Fund for Nature), Trail Blazers, The Turning Tide, RUR and Tetrapak Foundation, India. The event was sponsored by various organisations and had experts from environmental NGOs, the corporate sector, educationists, media and alumni of STIE on the panel of judges for the competitions.
- ❖ To mark the pre-launch of the festival, STIE organized **Daan Utsav** a week prior to Planit E, wherein the teacher trainees donated clothes, toys, books and stationery which were in usable condition to the children of the NGO Sparsha. This was done to practice and propagate the principle of reusing and recycling commodities. Christmas celebrations were ushered in by the **Joy of Giving Week** where each trainee contributed toiletry articles ranging from soaps, sanitizers, hand-washes, hair oil, toothpaste, tooth brushes and combs which were gifted as hampers to the street children who participated in the Planit −E festival. This served to sensitize the trainees to the needs of those less fortunate than themselves.
- ❖ This year saw an added dimension to the Ecofest in keeping with reaching out to community. Participation was opened to 20 street children from the NGO Sparsha without charging them a registration fee. Hampers of toiletries were presented to these children in addition to the prizes and certificates they won at the different competitions. This endeavor helped to create awareness in the teacher trainees that children who are less fortunate are not less capable than children studying in affluent schools.
- ❖ The fest was applauded and appreciated by the judges, principals of participating institutions, dignitaries and the stakeholders who witnessed it for its novelty in tapping the resourcefulness of the youth in ushering in a mega revolution aimed at environmental conservation.

Extension

➤ The college participated in the Extension Education Programmeconducetd by the Department of Life-long Learning and Extension (DLLE). All 99 students were enrolled for the same under the able guidance of Dr. CerenaD'Cunha and Ms.Reshma Rodrigues. Details of the activities opted for have been provided in **Annexure VII.**



5. Student Support and Progression

➤ The **Honoursprogramme** is a credit based enrichment course designed on the IDEA model.(Sheela) A summary of the activities organized for the trainees with the credits assigned to each and the grades awarded has been provided in Annexure IX.

The Campus Recruitmentsorganized by the Placement Cell helped the trainees to have a hands-on experience of how to present themselves at interviews and exposed them to the requirements of schools affiliated to the different Boards of education. The students were also trained in soft skills and oriented to the guidelines of preparing their job applications/resumes prior to the campus placement programme. 40 students were placed through this endeavor. Details of the schools by which they were employed are listed in Annexure X.The remaining 9 have also received offers from institutions but have kept their decisions on hold in case of receiving more lucrative offers. The Employer Satisfaction Survey was conducted to assess the contentment of employers who have absorbed students of STIE in the past years and the same is depicted graphically below.



➤ The TET (Teacher Eligibility Test) based on the National Curricular Framework has been introduced as an Indian entrance examination for teachers. It is conducted by both Central government and State governments in India and is mandatory for getting teaching jobs in government schools from Class 1 to Class 8. To orient the students to the finer nuances of preparing for this test,STIE organized a one day TET workshop conducted by Mr.Prakash Almeida on 27th March 2018. The session was attended by

- 145 teachers/teacher trainees who received a hands-on training on how to solve different types of questions ranging from language and mathematics to pedagogy. The feedback obtained from the delegates has been summarized in **Annexure XI.**
- ➤ An Alumni Meet was organized on 15th March 2018 and attended by 35 ex-students. They shared their success stories and also made suggestions as to how they could contribute their resources to the growth of their Alma Mater. In addition, the alumni were actively involved in the planning and execution of the All-Mumbai Interschool/Intercollegiate festival Planit-E and made it a roaring success by liaising with schools across the city taking the participation count to 77 institutions/980 participants.
- ➤ The students participated in the Intercollegiate festival 'Prayas' conducted by St.Xavier's Institute of Education and secured the 1st place for the Fashion Show and the 3rd place for the Dance Competition. Ms.NiralD'silva was awarded the 2nd Prize for the Intercollegiate Marathi Essay Writing competition on 'Gender Equality-A Dream or Reality organized by Hansraj Jivandas College of Education.
- ➤ The Grievance Redressal Committee addressed the difficulties faced by students and took appropriate action to help them overcome the same. The Anti-ragging Cell conducted a session to orient trainees to the need for refraining from teasing and bully-bossing. The need to maintain cordial relations with peers was stressed and students were assigned peer mentors.

6. Governance, Leadership and Management

- > The Institution employed the 360° feedback mechanism to obtain objective online evaluation of its performance from stakeholders ranging from students, parents, practice teaching schools, alumni and participants attending various activities conducted by the college. The links to the online feedback summary procured have been listed in **Annexure XI.**
- > In the academic year 2017-18 one staff member (Librarian-Ms.ShakuntalsNighot)was promoted from Grade 1 to 2.
- > The Institution has also applied **for permission to introduce the Integrated M.Ed Course** and is currently awaiting the same. The college underwent an Inspection in this regard and the communication in this regard is attached in **Annexure XII.**

- > A copy of the **proposed Budget for the year 2018-19** is also **given in annexure** XIII.
- > The Institution has both IQAC (Internal quality Assurance Cell) and CDC (College Development Cell). These committees met at timely intervals and monitored the quality of instruction and performance of the Institution on the whole.
- > STIE established several **collaborations** for the different activities such as:

It was in keeping with this concern that STIE chose to focus on the theme of 'Nurturing Environmental Literacy'. In this regard, activities and events were organized at 4 levels, namely, Community, Curricular, Co-curricular, and Institutional.
